
Animation

- » Animation first started out as still drawings, such as in cave paintings, which depicted animals or humans with multiple sets of legs, giving the illusion of movement.
- » Earliest known animation was created for Chinese inventor Ting Huan in 180 AD.
- » Examples of early animation:

 - 5. Praxinoscope












Stop Motion Animation

- » Stop motion animation utilises still frames that are put together using a specified time frame for each section to have a continuous flow throughout it.
- » Although a traditional animation, it is still widely used today by companies such as Aardman Animations and also used in children and adult programmes such as *Pingu* and *South Park*.
- » James Stuart Blackton was among the first to use the technique of stop motion.
- » As a cartoonist he created his drawings using chalk and board to create animated shorts such as <u>The Enchanted Drawing</u> (1900) and <u>Humorous Phases of Funny Faces</u> (1906).
